So much has been surprising in the film's journey from its national broadcast on Planet Green to winning an Emmy for Outstanding Individual Achievement in a Craft: Research, at the 31st Annual News and Documentary Emmy Awards.



We set out to educate the public about the true costs and consequences of hydraulic fracturing and natural gas drilling, and to empower citizens to make informed choices...and our work hasn't let up since!

With **you** and countless others, we have helped lift critical issues out of silence and obscurity and into the mainstream.

Who would have dreamed a year ago that hydraulic fracturing would be the theme of an episode of [CSI: Crime Scene Investigation](#)?!

And its amazing and heartening to me that [Pittsburg passed an ordinance that imposes a ban on gas drilling](#) within city limits **and** privileges community decision making over the rights of corporations. That New York Governor David Paterson issued an executive order that institutes a statewide moratorium on hydraulic fracturing until July 1, 2011. That the EPA is in the midst of an investigation into fracking.

Evidence, indeed, of the power in coming together around our deepest values.

Below, you will find highlights from our 2010 community engagement campaign, as well as a preview of new developments. We hope it will give you a sense of the impact we are having at a national and international level.

Over the year, we've accomplished a staggering amount with limited resources. Our capacity to meet

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COMMUNITY SCREENINGS IN US



From Harvard to the EPA to living rooms, churches, community centers, and high school classrooms, *Split Estate* has been shown in hundreds of screenings all over the country. Citizens everywhere have used the film broadly to educate their friends and neighbors, the media, and local, state, and national policy makers. (With the mid-term changes nearly upon us, there will be a new slate of public officials who will need to be informed of the issues.)

Throughout the year, we field emails and calls from landowners, farmers and ranchers needing to understand their rights and how to protect their land; from students seeking information for projects and papers; and from women and men who are sick and needing leads to health care and support. The *Split Estate* Community Engagement Campaign connects these and others to information and resources — and to each other.



Community organizers are drawing upon *Split Estate* to raise awareness and mobilize action for clean energy...and clean water. [Check out this great piece by Agit Pop](#), which uses excerpts from the film, to protect the New York water supply from contamination.

And teachers are bringing *Split Estate* to classrooms everywhere at the secondary and university level and to charter programs for youth-at-risk.
